I would like to thank our longstanding golf community partners for their unwavering support of our "little foundation that could": The Cleveland Women's Golf Association (CWGA), the Greater Cleveland Golf Association (GCGA), the Northern Ohio PGA Section Foundation and the Northern Ohio Golf Association (NOGA). Without their support, we could not have awarded over \$130,000 in college scholarships over the past two decades, provide golf instruction to hundreds of girls, or host a high school showcase event that has boasted a historic number of participants over the past three years.

events, we have been able to expand our clinic program this year. In addition to the OGGF Spring Clinics which are held in April/May, the OGGF will begin hosting Indoor Winter Clinics this February at indoor golf facilities throughout Northern Ohio. Taught by PGA Professionals, these clinics will help the beginner golfer to advanced player hone their golf skills.

It's been a pleasure getting to know the members of our village better the past three years as the Executive Director of the OGGF. I look forward to working with our partners in the future to continue to increase the opportunities for girls through the game of a lifetime—golf.



The deadline for Ohio high school seniors to apply for a 2023 scholarship is March 31. To make the application process easier, this year girls can fill it out and submit digitally at OGGF.org.

In addition to scholarships, the Foundation also awards girls financial aid throughout the year to travel and play in tournaments, locally, regionally and nationally. These applications are accepted year-round, available on our website.

Annual tournament showcases girl golfers from high schools across the state

With one of the biggest fields in tournament history, girls at the 21st Ohio Girls Golf Foundation Showcase this past July also carded some of the lowest scores in its history.

"On a picture-perfect weather day, we were thrilled to host girls from 27 schools from across the state," says OGGF Executive Director Lynne Plaisance.

Individuals and teams mixed things up with interactive clinics focusing on putting, chipping and bunker work led by local PGA and LPGA professionals, as well as an on-course clinic led by tournament headliner LPGA tour professional Barb Mucha and PGA professional Jimmy Beers exploring the connection of the mental process to the game.

At the end of the day, Clare Liu, an incoming freshman from Magnificat, shot a record-tying low score of four-under par, 68, to take medalist honors. She finished her round with back-to-back eagles. Coming in second place was Dixon Hill from Hathaway Brown with a 69, and tied for third were Cammy Reed from Magnificat and Ella Wong from Hawken, with 71.

Teams competing in the event included Aurora,

Avon, Avon Lake,
Boardman, Hathaway
Brown, Highland,
Hudson, Independence, Kent Roosevelt,
Lexington, Magnificat
and Medina. Magnificat teams nabbed the
number one and two




positions with scores of 302 and 323 strokes, and Hathaway Brown came in third place with a 338.

providing college scholar-ships, golf training programs and financial aid.



In 1996, the OGGF awarded its first \$1,000 scholarship and the program grew from there, with one girl winning the first year, then three girls the next year, seven the following year and growing to eight or more girls nearly every year throughout the 2000s. In 2022, we had the most applicants in our history.
